


# Neither love nor love

## Inspiration

Whenever I went out alone, my parents would always call me frequently because they were worried and needed to keep up to date with what was going on with me, which made me feel very distressed. At the same time, I talked to my friends and classmates about their lives with their parents, analysed similar experiences of growing up around them, and presented these experiences in an artistic way.

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#### Brainstorming

Under the influence of traditional Confucianism, Chinese children are always influenced by the idea that filial piety is the most important thing in their relationships. When faced with unreasonable demands from their parents, they are not brave enough to object, otherwise they are considered "unfilial".

The clock becomes distorted in the picture frame, indicating that one's time is interfered with by one's parents and one is not free to control it.



A finger pointing in one direction indicates that the parent believes that he or she is showing the child the right way to go.





Wrapped around the hand in a sticky gelatinous mass, the surface parental control is sticky, suffocating, and uncomfortable.






In the composition process, I hope to reflect the sense of love and hurt between family members pulling each other, so I added the red rope as a manipulation of the binding and pulling elements through each thing, interlinked and intertwined. The large dark colours are a reflection of the child's inner sadness, and the harsh red of the roses is a stimulus and a reflection of hopeful struggle and inner turmoil. The melting element is a hopeful melting of the iceberg relationship.

The "talent" I'm not good at, and performing in front of people will only be marionette and clumsy.









# PROTECTION

Child: a growing heart has to be carefully protected. Parent: You are not mature enough to know how to protect your heart.



# Final work

The language of the child's heart, in small words, carefully conveys his or her true thoughts, afraid of being criticised, fearful of being annihilated for his or her feeble self-awareness, and struggling to speak for himself or herself. Parents love their children, and children love their parents, which is why there is a contradiction between love and unlove. It is hoped that this project will enable parents to face up to the errors of their old perceptions, and that children will be able to understand more about the excessive care that their parents give them because they love them. The conflict between parents and children can be eased and harmonised after both sides have looked into the matter.
