


Background

The eyes of the lion dance are ringed with circles and a 'eye-dotting' ceremony is usually held before the lion dance. Vermilion is applied to the lion's eyes to symbolise the giving of life.

The southern lion, with a horn tied to its head, is powerful and rugged, and the resemblance is a cautionary tale, rumoured to have been made of iron in the old days to cope with the martial fighting that often occurred during lion dances.



The streets of Macao are awash with tile patterns, most of which are symmetrical with crosses, giving a sense of regularity, comfort and sophistication.




The mascot combines the horns and eyes of the lion dance with the symbolic elements of Macau's traditional patterns to create a lion dance figure that symbolises good luck and good fortune. The colours are also chosen to represent auspicious colours commonly used in lion dances, hoping to bring an infectious sense of luck, vitality and affinity.
